They then took part in a series of team building activities to earn points for their forms and houses. This now seems like a lifetime ago. The students have bonded and grown so much over this past half term. Our Year 7's have been nothing but positive and polite since starting school, their commitment to the school values has been amazing, with them earning 6719 positive points to date. Many students are well on their way to earning their lapel badges, which demonstrate our core values. We were overwhelmed by the number of applications received from Year 7 students to become representatives to, or year captains on, the Student Leadership Team. This shows how keen they are to make a difference at Tadcaster Grammar School.



The students have also made a great start to their lessons with many students being recognised for their contributions to their subjects both in and out of the classroom.

In tutor time (period 1) students have participated in lots of different activities, including writing a letter to their Year 11 self. 






Year 8 students are currently signing up to a penpal club which is due to be launched by the German Team.

### **BUILDING Skills for Life**



I hope you have enjoyed reading this newsletter. As always, it can only represent the smallest snapshot of the fantastic work which goes on at TGS every lesson, every day.

Looking back in my diary to the weekend before school opened in September, I wrote down the following three bullet points as guiding principles for our work in school this half term after a very unique and irregular period of time since March:

- 1. Students and staff safe and supported
- 2. Students to fully reengage with their complete curriculum
- Teaching, learning and pastoral support to be the highest quality under the Covid-19 restrictions

Reflecting on these principles, I am so proud of the work our students and staff have managed to complete over the last seven weeks in very challenging circumstances. The school has worked brilliantly as a community and we have collectively overcome the restrictions on our 'normal' school life resulting from our current Covid-19 operational plan. We have also all tried to uphold our core staff values of:

This half-term has taken us into many areas of unknown territory, including looking at alternatives to our traditional face-to-face events. You may have seen our superb Year 6 and Sixth Form 'virtual' information evenings, as well as our first ever global live broadcast on YouTube. You will be aware that we are operating in physically remote year group 'bubbles' around school. This means the staff have had to move between up to 6 teaching areas in a day. No mean feat when you realise that our 2 most distant teaching areas (not including PE spaces) are 227 paces apart!

A special 'well done' must go to our wonderful Year 7 students who have collectively managed their transition into the school with admirable responsibility and resilience.

Thank you for your support and confidence in the school. We do empathise with the challenges of being secondary school/sixth form parents, even in the most regular of times. I hope you feel we have lived up to your expectations.


