Dear parents, carers & students,

I hope this finds you well?

The light at the end of the Year 11 & 13 examinations tunnel is getting larger and brighter by the day. We only have a very few examinations left before we say farewell to our 16 and 18 year olds as they start a wonderfully long summer break. As these have been the first national examinations for two years, tensions could have been heightened, but our students have been superb and an inspiration to us all. We are very much looking forward to the forthcoming Year 11 & Year 13 Proms.

After a very challenging selection process with interested Year 12 students making formal applications, gaining references and being interviewed by senior staff and the chair of the local governing body, I am delighted to introduce our head students for 2022-23: Harriet Gibson and Gabriel Owens. They will lead the ever expanding student leadership teams within school and work with senior staff on operational policy to ensure all of our students have the best possible experience in school.



In other news, it has been wonderful to visit many of our partner primary schools in the locality recently. It's so interesting to speak with Year 6 and Year 5 students about their hopes and aspirations and what moving up to secondary school means for them. We are delighted to be welcoming 262 11 year olds into Year 7 in September.





Each year we say hello and wave goodbye to a number of staff. With over 175 adults working in school this tends to gather pace during the summer term. I would like to make you aware of a change on the senior leadership team. Ms Mulhern is leaving us as deputy headteacher after seventeen years of service to the school. This is farewell though, rather than goodbye as she will be working full time for the Trust from September.

Joining the senior team in September will be Matt Gill. Matt has been Deputy Headteacher at Bedale High School since 2017, where he has played a major role in improving teaching, curriculum design and outcomes. Prior to this he was an Assistant Headteacher at Rivers Academy, West London and an Associate

Assistant Headteacher at Harris Academy, Crystal Palace. His leadership practice in these schools focused on the Quality of Education, largely leading on teaching and learning, curriculum development and CPD. Prior to this he led a History department in London having trained and taught as a History teacher in Leeds.

Our co-curricular programme has started to gain pace in recent months, with many visits out of school during the week and at evenings and weekends. Recently we have seen the Year 10 Geographers visit York, Year 9 complete their Duke of Edinburgh expeditions, a sixth form visit to Leeds Courts and nearly all Year 12 attend a UCAS day at Leeds Beckett University - amongst many other activities. Year 7 will enjoy a three day residential in July in Lincolnshire, and next week sees our annual visit to Wimbledon back on the calendar. Over the weekend the school was represented alongside other local schools at York Pride - it was a great, if very warm, day. I would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge your support of these visits and also to thank the staff who work way beyond a 'normal' working week to make them happen.

Chromebook for Learning scheme

The online portal, where you can order a device from our partner 'Freedomtech Technology' opened on Wednesday 1st June and will close on Sunday 31st July. Please be aware that although you may find cheaper alternatives to purchase online or on the high street, the extended warranty and free repair service for accidental damage may not be available for such devices. Even the most careful student can accidentally damage a chromebook, and over the years many parents have benefitted from the free repair service and extended warranty included in the Freedomtech package.

Freedomtech are also offering parents of other year groups to update their student chromebook, so visit our website and follow links to the relevant portal if you wish to do so. The device will be the same as that currently offered to incoming Year 7 students, but pricing plans will reflect the length of time remaining in school.

You can, if you wish, purchase a chromebook elsewhere for your child to use in school. It must meet the same specification as the devices offered by the scheme, and you will also need to order a 'Google education licence' through the school to allow it to benefit from the applications and device management we offer. This is a one-off cost of £25.00. (see website for more details)

School leaver Destinations September 2022

Schools and colleges are required to share data about the destination activity of their students with the local authority. This supports the duty of the local authority to track all young people from 16-19 years. This helps to identify those young people that are not in education, employment or training (NEET) and to offer them support once they have left school.

To ensure the most up to date data is collected for Tadcaster Grammar School students, parents/careers of current Year 11 and 13 students will receive a form to complete at the end of August to confirm their child's destination. This information is statutory information required for NYCC, regardless of the local authority the student resides in.

Application for Free School Meals

Circumstances can change for anyone, as the enormous impact from the pandemic continues to prove. Some families can suddenly find themselves trying to cope with a new financial strain and pressure, perhaps as a result of a stressful new situation: separation, loss of a job, decreased working hours, illness etc. If your household income is low or has recently decreased, your child may well qualify for Free School Meals. Indeed, over the last two years, we have seen a significant rise in successful applications.

If you wish to apply for Free School Meals, you can complete the application form: Free school meals

In addition to securing free school meals, your child would also become eligible for Pupil Premium funding. This provides school with money that we utilise to support your child with additional educational opportunities - <u>Pupil premium - GOV.UK</u>.

We also work closely with our local food banks, who continue to offer vital support to families.

Applications for 16 - 19 Bursary Funding in Sixth Form

If your child currently attends Sixth Form or is joining the Sixth Form from September 22 and your household income is below £28,000 per year or if your child is eligible for free school meals, you may qualify for financial help from the 16-19 Bursary fund whilst your child is studying at Sixth Form.

The 16-19 Bursary fund is provided by the Government and can help with any education-related costs that may arise during the school year such as transport to school, educational visits or extra help to buy books, clothing or equipment for the A level courses.

To apply for bursary funding, your child must be at least 16 years old and under 19 years old at the start of the 2022-23 Academic Year i.e entering Year 12 or 13 - full time Sixth Form education.
