

GCSE Photography

GCSE photography allows our students to engage in lens-based art, which encourages them to be imaginative, thoughtful and technical whilst also balancing this with the ability to analyse, deconstruct and explore the work of photographers and artists.

There is an expectation that student transfer images from devices when at home to be able to engage fully in lesson time activities.

Students have a Photoshop Licence, we encourage them to 'play' and learn regularly with the software. They require the Adobe Creative App on their phones. They require there school drive & email set up on their mobile phones.

Every lesson counts: attendance, productivity and positive working relationships during lessons is the key to success.

Both courses have 2 components.

Component 1: 60% of the overall mark is on-going coursework. Component 2: 40% is exam work.

Both of which involves practical work leading to final outcomes.

TOP ADVICE:

You must aim to do performance practice every day for at least 20 minutes. Make sure you know what your performance pieces are and really focus on them.

Please ask your teacher if there are any keywords you are unsure of as you go through Y11.

Don't leave your compositions to the last minute!

Y11 Music is about applying the skills you build up in Y10 to create your performances and compositions.

You will also be continuing to explore the 4 Areas of Study - Musical Forms and Devices, Ensemble, Film and Pop Music.

Performing - 30% Assessed through two performances in Y11 - solo and ensemble.

Composing - 30% Assessed through two compositions in Y11 - free and to a brief.

Appraising - 40% Assessed through a Y11 exam.

TOP ADVICE:

Learn your key terms- if you know your key terms you will understand any question and be able to answer everything in some way.

Learn at least 5 quotes per unit- this will enable you to use quotes to gain higher markslots of quotes can be used for many areas for example:

'Do not kill'- Animal rights, abortion, death penalty, Euthanasia.

Learn the written structures per question- this will ensure you are not panicked regarding how much to write.

For example: Question 4 6 marks is P (point) E (explain or example) x AND make sure you add a quote -DO NOT PLONK IT!.
